NEW DALY CITY THEATRE OPENS NEXT TUESDAY NIGHT

MAYOR SMITH AND OTHER OFFICIALS TO AID IN DEDICATION

The new Daly City Theatre, the construction of which residents of Daly City have watched with pride, will open Tuesday, November 27. This date will mark the beginning of a new era for the amusement loving people of Daly City, Colma and vicinity.

"The utmost in entertainment and service will be our aim in operating the Daly City Theatre," reads a statement issued today by Edward B. Baron and Carol A. Nathan, who have taken a long lease on the theatre. "The best the market affords in motion pictures and stage entertainment will be provided for our patrons," the statement continues.

Mayor Will Speak
Mayor H. H. Smith of Daly City
will preside at the dedication Tuesday
night. The dedicatory address will be
made by J. E. McCurdy, city attorney.
There will be no other formality, as
it is the belief of Messrs. Baron and
Nathan that the public is most interested in the theatre and the entertainment to be found therein.

A lavish program for opening night is in preparation, but a complete list of its attractions was not available at the time of going to press. Among the special event nights which will be scheduled regularly are: Wednesday, a Juvenile Revue; Saturday, Ellen Rose's Dancing Dolls in a diminutive revue to be staged both at the matinee and evening performance; Sunday, vaudeville and special acts under the direction of a master of ceremonies.

Music, perfectly scored to the pictures, will be provided by a \$22,500 Robert Morton orchestral organ, which reproduces every instrument in an orchestra.

Architecture is Unique

The architecture of the new theatre is unique. There is no theatre of its type in San Francisco or on the Peninsula. It is built after the style which is considered the newest thing in theatrical construction, the atmospheric theatre. This creates the effect of a theatre "under the stars" with the audience seated under a "blue sky" ceiling and surrounded by a garden. Fleecy clouds float lazily in the sky, a fountain tinkles in the center of the lobby and fresh, clean air from a highly perfected ventilating system completes the illusion of a theatre in the open air.

The garden scenes are painted realistically in a series of panels encircling the entire auditorium. They are set in eighteen openings in a Spanish wall which completely surrounds the audience. By clever lighting these scenes are made to appear outside the theatre.

Seats Are Comfortable

Nothing has been overlooked that would add to the comfort, convenience or safety of patrons. All seats are on one floor, which slopes gently so that an unobstructed view may be had of the stage and screen from any of the 1,250 seats. The stage is one of the largest in any community theatre in the Bay region and is capable of accommodating most elab-

orate attractions.

Smoking and retiring rooms are complete, spacious and comfortable.

The very latest equipment has been installed in the projection room, insuring perfect pictures on the screen

and a total absence of eye strain.


Heavily carpeted floors will add to
