corporators and stockholders in the
Frederick Amusement Company
which has leased and will operate
the new Ramona Theatre, making its
formal opening Thursday evening.
The company was formed some time
ago when the idea for the new play-
house was yet in the making and it
has in the past few months operated
the Gem and Grand Theatres which
it absorbed from G. E. Kadane and
Edward Kadane.

G. E. Kadane is president of the
new concern, P. V. Ruch is vice-pres-
ident, Miss Margaret Kadane is sec-
retary-treasurer and Edward G. Ka-
dane is manager. Other stockhold-
ers include Dr. Roy Fisher, R. E.
Tomlinson, J. B. Beard, Jr., D. M.
Long, Cecil Chamberlin, A. S. Reaves
and John H. Mounts.

Through this group is made pos-
sible construction of the new show
and its presentation to the south-
western Oklahoma and northwestern
Texas public.

The company owns the equipment
in the playhouse and will operate
the building under lease from J. B.
Beard, Jr., its owner.

rience in Business

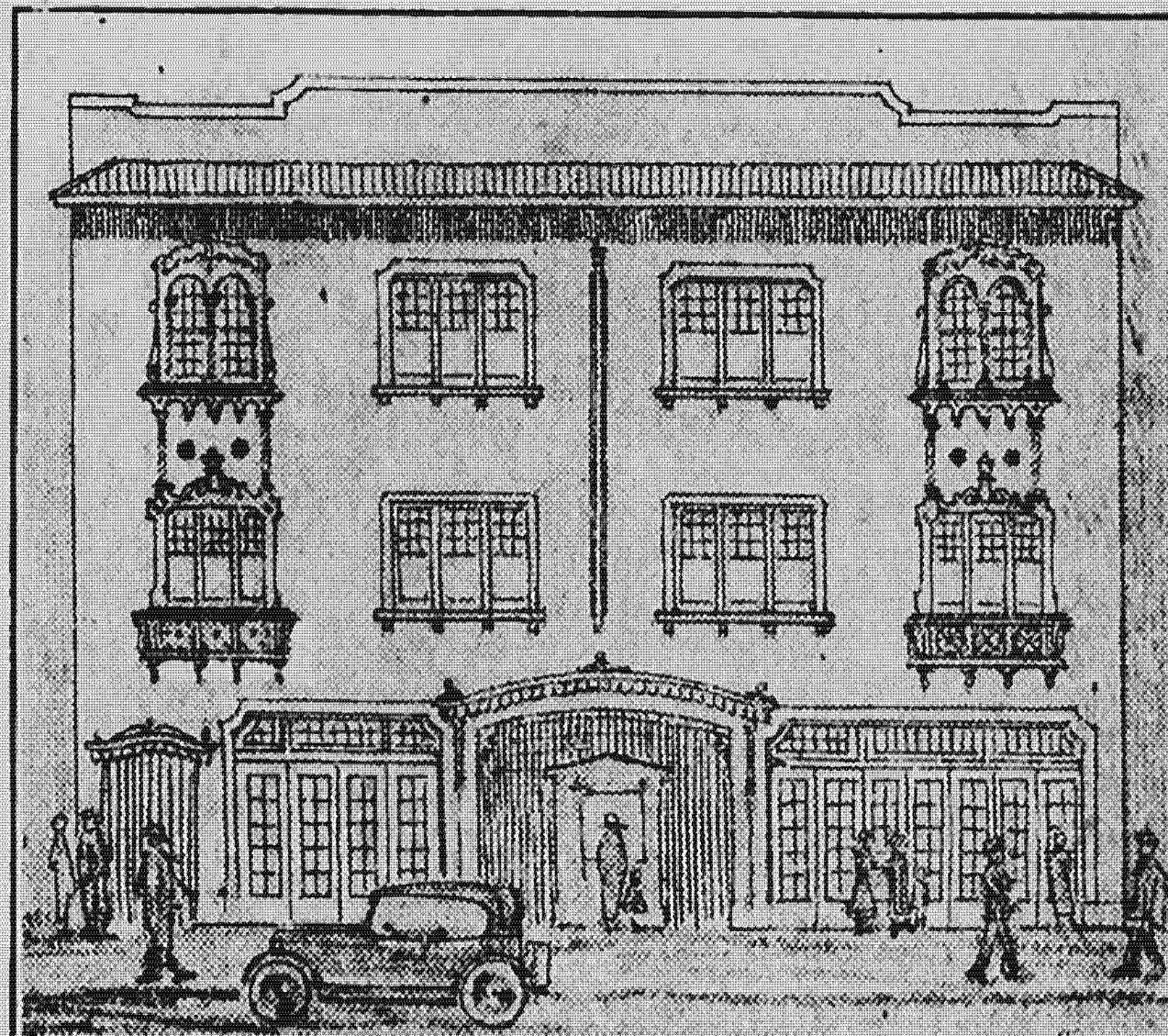
From his entrance into the show
business a little over three years ago
to management of the beautiful new
Ramona Theatre is the achievement
of Eddie Kadane, who, in March,
1926, with his father, purchased the
Gem Theatre from C. B. Greever
and took a five-year lease on the
building. Prior to taking manage-
ment of the Gem, Kadane had short
experience as an employee of theat-
res in Wichita Falls.

His management extended to its
second theatre in September, 1926,
when the Kadanes purchased the
Criterion Theatre, changing its name
to the Grand. The third playhouse
in Frederick was purchased in
March, 1928, when the A-Mus-U was
taken over and later closed down to
make way for construction of the
new show.

Kadane's management has been
attended by marked success through-
out and he has taken a distinctive
place among Oklahoma and North
Texas showmen. He is a member of
the State Board of Arbitration of
Theatre Owners.

J. B. BEARD OWNER OF FREDERICK'S NEW THEATRE

Faith in City's Future Brought
Heavy Investment in Busi-
ness Property

J. B. Beard, Jr., vice-president and
cashier of the First National Bank,
is the owner and builder of Freder-
ick's new Ramona Theatre and the
structure itself is a creditable tribute
to his foresight in providing this sec-
tion of the state with one of the
most modern of playhouses, as well
as a tribute to his public spirit.

Mr. Beard has owned the property
on which the new building stands for
some time. He has spent many
thousands of dollars in building the
theatre where the old structures
formerly stood.

complete equipment indicate that
no expense was spared in making it
as complete and modern as possible.

G. E. Kadane, one of the organiz-
ers and president of the Frederick
Amusement Company, drew all plans
for the building and was the super-
vising architect and engineer. Con-
crete and brick work was in charge
of A. H. Krause, well known Fred-
erick contractor.

PLAN PROGRAM FOR INITIAL SHOWING

Cecil Chamberlin Will Be Mas-
ter of Ceremonies; Offer
Feature Picture Bill

Frederick will take its place of
prominence in the theatrical realm
Thursday evening when the beau-
tiful Ramona Theatre—a dream real-
ized by a group of Frederick business
men—is formally opened to the pub-
lic. Crowds that will tax capacity of
the playhouse of more than 1000
seating capacity are expected to
greet the first showing to be fea-
tured by a short dedicatory program
and a special picture bill.

Artists, electricians, decorators,
tile men, plumbers, plasterers, sound
equipment specialists and others
have been working night and day on
the new building during the past
month to have the structure com-
pleted and equipped at the earliest
possible date. Only final details
were being attended to Wednesday
in preparation for the opening event
Thursday.

NEWEST TYPE SOUND EQUIPMENT FOR RAMONA

**Machines Will Handle Either
Disk Reproduction or Im-
pressions on Film**

No expense has been spared by the Frederick Amusement Company in installing the most modern and complete equipment for reproduction of sound and synchronized musical pictures. Manager E. G. Kadane has said, and with the perfect acoustical arrangement of the show, clear reproduction is assured in the new playhouse.

Combination Vitaphone and Movietone machines have been installed. As explained by Kadane, Vitaphone embodies the reproduction of

sound, talking and music by the use of a recording disk while Movietone is reproduction from modulations recorded on the celluloid film.

Thus far in Frederick, Gem Theatre productions have been confined to the Vitaphone type or disk. With the new equipment in the Ramona, however, both may be presented and Kadane has promised at an early date to present a picture with the sound recorded on the film, announcing it as such so people of this community may hear the latest in sound reproduction.

Due to the sensitiveness of the film type, however, Vitaphone disks

have proved the most reliable type of recording and this handicap has made the Vitaphone much more popular than far in the theatre realm.

A representative of the Vitaphone and Movietone builders has been in Frederick during the week, equipping and testing the building for sound pictures and the most modern in this popular type of entertainment is promised Ramona Theatre goers.

The reproducing machines are being coupled to the theatre's two Simplex projectors and the booth of the new theatre will be one of the most completely equipped in this section of the state.

lobby, into the foyer and thence to the main floor, mezzanine and balcony.

Its composite beauty is beyond comparison with a similar building in this section and one must see to appreciate its artistic completeness.

From the tiled entrance, softly carpeted floors, on through to the modern stage, the playhouse is the latest thing in theatre construction, combining a new departure in scenic beauty and every convenience for the comfort of patrons.

The mezzanine floor is covered with a heavily padded tufted rug which encircles also the balcony entrance and flows down the stairway into the foyer. The walls are beautifully finished with blended colors splashed on a tan background.

Electrical fixtures are of special design throughout. All wood finishing is in southern gum and hundreds of pieces of ornamental plastic work go to make up the structure's interior.

The setting is representative of a Spanish garden and the walls rising on either side of the building represent Spanish architecture. The curved ceiling above represents the sky, painted a deep blue, and scattered about and twinkling are tiny stars, controlled by automatic blinkers.

Two emblematic tapestries hang high on either wall. Woodwork on the cornice is highly decorative and in every nook and corner artists have added touches of color that bring many hues into pleasing combination.

Scores from out of the city are expected to be here for the occasion and in addition representatives of several film companies and theatre supply companies will greet the op-

ening.

It is planned to open the doors at 6:45 o'clock to allow preliminary inspection of the building. At 7:15 Cecil Chamberlin, a stockholder in the Frederick Amusement Company, operators of the Ramona, will have charge of a short dedicatory program in which the show will be presented

to the public and Mayor J. J. Rogers will respond on behalf of the citizens of Frederick.

News events will be the first picture offering followed by an all-sound vaudeville specialty, featuring the act of Broadway entertainers, H. Rosenthal. A selected talking comedy will follow and then the feature, "Gold Diggers of Broadway," Warner Brothers' all-sound natural color success.

Finishing the regular daily run will begin.

MEZZANINE FEATURE SELDOM FOUND ELSEWHERE

Provides Quiet Atmosphere For Party Gatherings and Rest From Motor Travel

Few theatres in Oklahoma and none in Northwest Texas boast as lavishly appointed and spacious a mezzanine floor as the beautiful space that is a feature of the new Ramona Theatre. The Orpheum is the only playhouse in Oklahoma City with a similar accommodation and none of the theatres in nearby towns have a mezzanine.

Its size and construction is carefully in keeping with beauty of the rest of the show. Its several hundred square feet of floor space is covered with heavily tufted carpeting and the setting is made beautiful by pale pink glass in the French doors that front on the west.

Wicker and velvet upholstered furniture provides ample seating room and electrical fixtures are of the Spanish period design. Rest rooms for ladies and men open off the floor as does the office of the manager.

It is further adorned by palms and flower vases and in the eastern extremity is a drinking fountain, set on tile base. Insets in the walls are occupied with more of the vases and other novelties that lend additional grace to the composite structure.

Those who have seen the theatre in its construction proclaim the mezzanine floor as one of its most delightful features.

STAGE COMPLETELY HEATING, COOLING EQUIPPED FOR ALL KINDS OF SHOWS

Automatically Controlled Curtains Handled From Projection Booth

An outstanding feature of the new Ramona Theatre which is to be opened to the public Thursday evening is the stage equipment. To accommodate the modern fittings, the building was constructed with a curtain loft that permits the raising and lowering of any set without rolling. This is a decided advantage.

Gracing the front is an extra heavy crimson velvet curtain that pulls to either side. It has an ornamental painting and is sewed with radiant jewels. Atop this is a valance of lighter crimson, decorated with brilliants.

The grand drapery and "tormenters" are of gold satin with painted designs and jewels. For use with vaudeville acts there is a metallic screen curtain of silver and green hue, the color of which changes under spotlights. There are bright red cascades on either side.

The advertising curtain is of heavy scenic ducking.

The main curtains are controlled from the projection booth to be closed and reopened at the conclusion of each showing.

There is further equipment for the presentation of almost every conceivable type of show.

Careful Check of Temperatures Will Be Kept

Ready for either cool or warm weather, complete heating and cooling plants have been installed in the new Ramona.

Gastream radiators, conveniently located on both floors, will provide

the heat and built-in cooling fans, drawing air through a special washing process in the summer and through by-passes from the washing system in the winter, will afford coolness.

The building has been arranged with vents at the rear so that air in the structure can be changed in a very few minutes and periodic checks will be made to keep an even temperature in the building.

Building Contractor For The Ramona

NO PRICE CHANGES WILL BE MADE IN NEW THEATRE

Same Charges Will Be Made Every Day in New Ramona After Formal Opening

A fixed price schedule to run throughout the year has been announced by Manager E. G. Kadane for the new Ramona Theatre and no extra will be charged for feature pictures at any time, Kadane has said.

On the opening night when the entire building will be thrown open for public inspection, the admission will be 20 cents for children and 50 cents for adults.

Beginning Friday, both on weekdays and Sunday, prices on the main floor will be 20 cents for children and 50 cents for adults and in the balcony 10 cents for children and 35 cents for adults.

"We will establish these prices as a permanent policy for the theatre. These are in keeping with or below prices charged in other northwestern Texas and southwestern Oklahoma cities," Kadane said.

Instead of the policy that has been maintained at The Gem of passing patrons in from the window, tickets will be sold to be taken by ushers inside.

There will be no reserved seats for opening program of the new theatre. However, to assist in handling the crowd, tickets will be in sale at the box office beginning at 4:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon.

FLASHER SIGN ON NEW BUILDING

An 18-foot vertical sign with the name "Ramona" and a flasher sunburst and side panels graces front of the new theatre and it is a creditable addition to the city's business district.

More than 200 globes are used in the two sides of the light and in the interior, illuminating the letters. The sunburst falls from the top and has the effect of flowing down the long sides of the sign.
