MASONIC CATHEDRAL DEDICATED

Long Beach Organization
Now Occupies Half-Million
Dollar Home

LONG BEACH, Sept. 11.—All Southern California was represented here tonight at the formal dedication of the new \$500,000 Scottish Rite Cathedral, when at the end of a three-day ceremony, during which several hundred Masons were invested with various degrees of the great order, an impressive dedicatory service was held at the cathedral, followed by a reception to all candidates.

Perry W. Weidner of Los Angeles, Thirty-third Degree and Sovereign Grand Inspector-General for the Scottish Rite bodies in California, was in charge of the dedicatory ceremonies, which were attended by members of the rite only and ladies escorted by members. Prominent among those assisting in the ceremony was Audry Rivers Park. K.C.C.H., Deputy Sovereign Grand Inspector-General, a Long Beach Mason who has played a prominent part in making a reality of building the magnificent Scottish Rite edifice at Elm avenue and Ninth street.

Scottish Rite Masons from the Valleys of San Diego, Pasadena, Santa Barbara and Los Angeles swelled the number of those attending from the various towns and cities of Long Beach Valley.

The ceremony was preceded by a thirty-minute musical program arranged by W. Conrad Mills.
